What is this product?

TYPE OF PRODUCT

The product is a sub-fund of Lux Multimanager SICAV, an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

TERM

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However, the Board of Directors of the Sub-Fund may decide to close the Sub-Fund under certain circumstances.

OBJECTIVES

The Sub-Fund promotes environmental and social characteristics pursuant to article 8 of SFDR but has no sustainable investment objectives, as described in Appendix I of the Prospectus.

The Sub-Fund invests mainly in a broad range of equities of companies across any sector and market capitalisation that are domiciled in developed markets.

In order to pursue its investment strategies, the Sub-Fund will invest in the instruments detailed below and will obey all the restrictions detailed in section 25. ("General Investment Restrictions"). The permitted instruments include the following:

- Equities and Equity-linked Instruments, including up to 5% of its net assets in P-notes and up to 50% of its net assets in depositary receipts (ADR/GDR);
- Money Market Instruments;
- Deposits with credit institutions;
- Up to 10% of its net assets in UCITS/UCIs.

The Sub-Fund may use derivatives such as futures for efficient portfolio management.

The benchmark is MSCI World incl net dividends in EUR (the "Benchmark"). For share classes which have a different currency than the Base Currency of the Sub-Fund, the Benchmark will not be hedged towards the currency of the share class for calculation of relative performance but it will be calculated in the share class currency. The Sub-Fund in itself does not aim to track the performance of the Benchmark. The Benchmark is provided for comparative purpose only and the performance of the Sub-Fund may deviate from the Benchmark. The Benchmark is a broad market index, which does not assess or include its constituents according to environment characteristics and therefore is not necessarily aligned with the environmental characteristics promoted by the Sub-Fund.

INTENDED RETAIL INVESTOR

The product is suitable for institutional investors. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years.

The risk can be significantly different if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because the Fund is not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level. Poor market conditions could impact the Fund's capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

This Fund does not include any protection from future market performance, so you could lose some or all of your investment. If the Fund is not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

Performance scenarios

What happens if WAYSTONE FUND MANAGEMENT (LUX) S.A. is unable to pay out?

There is no guarantee in place against the default of the Fund and you could lose your capital if this happens.

The Sub-Fund's assets are held with CACEIS Bank, Luxembourg Branch and are segregated from the assets of other sub-funds of the Fund. The assets of the Sub-Fund cannot be used to pay the debts of other sub-funds.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.

How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?

Recommended Holding Period (RHP): 5 years.

The RHP was chosen to provide a consistent return less dependent on market fluctuations.

The net asset value per share is determined on each day that are simultaneously a bank working day and trading day in Luxembourg (the "Valuation Day").

The net asset value is calculated and published on the first business day following the relevant valuation day excluding the 24 December of each year (the "NAV calculation day").

Shares will be redeemed at the net asset value per share determined as at the relevant valuation day. The dealing cut-off day is one business day prior to the valuation day ("business cut-off day").

Applications must be received by the registrar and transfer agent no later than 1.00 p.m. Luxembourg time on each business day. Any applications received after the applicable deadline will be processed in respect of the next valuation day.

Payment for redeemed shares must be made no later than 3 (three) business days after the relevant valuation day.
